Important Notices

Forest Area Community Schools is required to make several public notices at the beginning of the school year. Please carefully review the next few pages of the newsletter to ensure you have all the information you need for a successful year.

Student Records

Student records, other than directory information shall be available only to students and their parents, eligible students, and designated school personnel who have a legitimate educational interest in the information, or to other individuals or organizations as permitted by law. The term "parents" includes legal guardians or other persons standing in loco parentis (such as a grandparent or step parent with whom the child lives, or a person who is legally responsible for the welfare of the child). The term "eligible student" refers to a student who is eighteen (18) years of age or older, or a student of any age who is enrolled in a postsecondary institution.

"Legitimate educational interest" shall be defined as a "direct or delegated responsibility for helping the student achieve one or more of the educational goals of the District" or if the administrative, supervisory or instructional task or to perform a service or benefit for the student or the student's family.

To request this information or amend a child's educational records, please contact the principal of the building the child attends or most recently attended. The District will comply with a legitimate request for access to a student's records within a reasonable period of time. Based upon reasonable requests, viewers of educational records will receive explanation and interpretation of the records.

Only "directory information" regarding a student shall be released to any person or party, other than the student or his/her parent, without the written consent of the parent; or if the student is an eligible student, the written consent of the student except those persons or parties stipulated by the District's policy and administrative guidelines and/or those specified in the law. If you believe that your rights have been violated under Federal Law (FERPA and the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment), please contact the FACS Superintendent, 7741 Shippy Road SW, Fife Lake, MI 49633

Instructional Materials Review

If you are interested in reviewing instructional materials used by the district, please complete the following procedure:

- 1. Make the request to the principal of the building in which the instructional materials are used.
- 2. Submit completed form 9130F3 to the building principal.
- 3. Upon receipt of the form, the principal will schedule an appointment for you to visit the building to review and inspect the material indicated on the form.
- 4. Upon inspection and review, if you would like to file a complaint about the instructional materials, you should contact the FACS Superintendent at (231) 369-4191, who will help you follow the complaint procedures outlined in FACS School Board Policy.

Information Release to Military Recruiters

Two federal laws and one Michigan law require Forest Area Community Schools to provide military recruiters, upon request, names, addresses and telephone numbers of high school students. A parent/guardian or 18 year old student may exercise the option to withhold consent for the release of this information to military recruiters by signing and returning the form below to the Forest Area High School office. Source Water Assessment

Notice to the Public: Water Quality Annual Report Amendment to Act 1976 PA 339 Michigan Safe Drinking Water Act - R325.10416. Per the above citation of law this report is made known to all concerned as follows:

- 1. A summary of water sampling compliance data for the previous calendar year and copies of laboratory results are on file at the office of the superintendent, 7741 Shippy Road SW, Fife Lake, MI 49633. Office hours are 7 a.m.-4 p.m. Mon-Fri during school (7 a.m.-3:30 p.m. in summer).
- 2. Copies of the actual water analysis reports and/or any violation notices are available upon request.
- 3. This information is required for all K-12 schools and child care centers that are also nontransient, noncommunity public water supplies as an annual report to the public. For information, contact FACS at (231) 369-4191.

MI Immunization Requirements

A child enrolling in public, private, parochial or denominational school in Michigan for the first time shall submit one of the following: 1.) statement signed by a physician that child has been tested for and immunized or protected against diseases specified by the director of public health, 2.) statement signed by parent/guardian that child has not been immunized because of religious convictions or other objections, 3.) request signed by parent/guardian that local health department gives the needed protective immunization. In addition, a statement that vision and hearing tests were passed is required unless parent indicates in writing that child cannot submit to the tests because of religious convictions.

Michigan law prohibits a principal or teacher from admitting new students without record of having at least one dose of each: measles, mumps, rubella, polio, diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis. Records for all entering kindergarten students and students enrolled from outside the district will be reviewed to ensure immunizations are up-to-date. Notice will be sent to parents/guardians if there is no immunization record upon school entry or if records are incomplete. Students not in compliance with immunization requirements will be excluded from school until documentation of immunization is presented. Michigan law requires that all students be immunized against the diseases listed in the chart below. Immunizations can be obtained from a physician or health department.

Substance Abuse Policy

Matters pertaining to Drug-Free Workplace/Drug-Free Schools & Communities Act Amendments of 1989. Public Law 101-226

Forest Area Community Schools district (FACS) believes that use of illicit drugs and the unlawful possession of alcohol is wrong and harmful. Age- and developmentally-appropriate drug and alcohol education and prevention programs which address legal, social and health consequences of drug and alcohol use and provide effective techniques for resisting peer pressure.

- 1. FACS prohibits unlawful possession, use or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol on school premises or as part of any of its activities. *COMPLIANCE IS MANDATORY*.
- 2. Disciplinary action (consistent with local, state and federal law) up to and including expulsion and referral for prosecution, will be imposed upon students who violate.
- 3. Discipline will be applied appropriately to the offense and offender following Forest Area Suspension and Expulsion Policy guidelines. Discipline may include a.) Completion of an appropriate rehabilitation program at parent/guardian expense, b.) Referral for prosecution. Parents are encouraged to seek family counseling agencies as necessary, with the associated costs borne by the parent.
- 4. FACS will review its drug prevention program at least biannually to a.) determine program effectiveness and implement changes if needed, b.) ensure that disciplinary actions are enforced.

Teacher/Paraprofessional Qualifications

FACS is a school that receives federal funds from Title I and parents and guardians may request the following information about the professional qualifications of teacher(s):


- 1. Whether the teacher has met Michigan licensing requirements for the grade level(s) and subject area(s) for which the teacher provides instruction;
- 2. Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status through which Michigan licensing requirements have been waived;
- 3. The teacher's college degree(s), major(s), and field(s) of discipline, as well as any graduate degree or certification. You may also request this information about any paraprofessional who provides Title I services to your child. If you would like to receive this information, please contact the superintendent, FACS. Your request will be processed in a timely manner.

Complaint Procedure

Any person who believes they have been discriminated against or denied equal opportunity or access to programs or services may file a complaint with the district's Civil Rights Coordinator, Superintendent, FACS, 7741 Shippy Road SW, Fife Lake, MI 49633 (231) 369-4191. The individual may also contact the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Civil Rights, 600 Superior Avenue, Room 750, Cleveland, Ohio 44114-2611.

Vaccines Required for School Entry in Michigan

Whenever children are in group settings, there is a chance for disease to spread. Parents must follow state vaccine laws in order for their children to attend school. These laws are the minimum standard for preventing disease outbreaks in group settings. The best way to protect children from serious diseases is to follow the recommended vaccination schedule at www.CDC.gov/Vaccines. When following the recommended schedule children are fully protected and any school vaccination requirements are met.



Vaccines should be given at certain ages and at certain times (follow CDC Immunization Schedule for the recommended number of does, correspirate, and ages), this chart is based on Michigan school immunization requirements. We strongly encourage parents and providers to follow the CDC recommended schedule because school requirement are the minimum for protection. Follow this chart when assessing immunization status of school immunization requirements. The chief has not received these vaccines, documented immunity/waveer is requirements, incompletely vaccinated chiefer may be excluded from school. Parents and guardans choosing to decline vaccines must obtain a certified non-medical wavier from a local health department. Read more about waviers at your michigan gov/minutige. Pest Management Advisory

Forest Area Community Schools uses an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) approach to control pests. IPM uses all suitable techniques to prevent pests from reaching unacceptable levels or to reduce an existing population to an acceptable level. Techniques emphasize pest exclusion and biological controls. However, as with most pest control programs, chemical controls may also be utilized. You have the right to be informed prior to any pesticide application made to the school grounds or buildings. In certain emergencies, such as an infestation of stinging insects, pesticides may be applied without prior notice to prevent injury to students. You will be notified following any such application. If you need prior notification, please complete the form below and submit it to your school principal.

Student Insurance

All athletes must have Interscholastic Athletic Coverage if they are not covered through a family policy. Each athlete must have a waiver signed by a parent indicating they have adequate insurance, or be covered through the Interscholastic Athletic Insurance before participating in sports activities. Coaches will have the necessary forms.

Title I

Title I paraprofessionals will serve Forest Area Community Schools in Grades K-5. Title I staff members work with classroom teachers and students in math, reading, science, social studies and computer technology to help children make optimal educational gains.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

federal law requires that Forest Area Community Schools, with certain exceptions, obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, Forest Area may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the District to the contrary in accordance with District procedures. The purpose of directory information is to allow Forest Area to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications such as a playbill, yearbook, honor roll, graduation programs, and sports activity sheets. Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks. In addition, two federal laws require local educational agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories – names, addresses and telephone listings – unless parents have advised the LEA that they do not want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent.

If you do not want Forest Area to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must annually notify the District in writing. Please send notification by *Sept. 15, 2025* to: Office of the Superintendent, 7741 Shippy Road SW, Fife Lake, MI 49633. Forest Area has designated the following information as directory information: Student name, address, and telephone listing; date and place of birth; major field of study; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; weight and height, if members of an athletic team; dates of attendance; date of graduation; degrees, honors, and awards received; honor rolls or scholarships received.

Privacy Notice Consent Opt-Out

The Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), 20 USC § 1232h, requires Forest Area Community Schools to obtain consent or allow you to opt your child out of participating in certain school activities, including a student survey, analysis, or evaluation in an applicable program in one or more of the following eight areas:

- 1. Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or parent;
- 2. Mental/psychological problems of the student or family;
- 3. Sex behavior or attitudes;
- 4. Illegal, antisocial, self-incriminating or demeaning behavior;
- 5. Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
- 6. Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, physicians, or ministers;
- 7. Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parent/guardian;
- 8. Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility or financial assistance.

This opt-out right also applies to the collection, disclosure, or use of student information for marketing purposes ("marketing surveys") and to certain physical exams and screenings.
