Located in beautiful northern Michigan, approximately 35 minutes southeast of Traverse City, the Forest Area Community is a year-round scenic and outdoor recreation destination. It offers a variety of rural and village living options. With its proximity to Traverse, and with US-131 running through the district, shopping, entertainment, recreational, cultural, and post-secondary educational opportunities are all convenient and accessible.

Forest Area Community Schools has two campuses located a few minutes apart. We provide full-time bussing for student pickup and drop off each school day. Fife Lake Elementary is located 108 Pierce Street in beautiful Fife Lake, MI. Our elementary school includes preschool through third grade students.
